

Business Fire Safety Checklist



Schedule Regular Maintenance/Housekeeping check for the following hazards:

This checklist can be used as a reminder to review business fire safety procedures. Know and understand your municipal building fire and safety codes. It's recommended that employers work with outside certified professionals where appropriate.

- **G** Equipment that sparks or smokes
- □ Frayed cords or wiring
- □ Limit the number of electrical cords in a socket/outlet
- Cracked or broken switch or receptacle plates
- **D** Ensure outlets are in good working order
- **D** Ensure grounding pin and prongs on wire plugs are intact and not bent
- □ Check fuses or circuit breakers
- Prohibit temporary wiring
- **D** Ensure proper shielding on high-intensity lights, especially if the lights are near flammable items
- □ Keep combustible items away from power sources
- Make sure workspaces, walkways, and equipment are clean and clear of combustible debris (i.e. dust or grease buildup)
- □ Keep exit routes free of explosive or highly flammable furnishings or other decorations
- □ Keep exit routes free and unobstructed (no materials or equipment may be placed, either permanently or temporarily, within the exit route)
- □ Flammable liquids are properly labeled and stored
- □ Properly dispose of expired flammable liquids
- Assure that all portable fire extinguishers are inspected and maintenance tested by a professional on an annual basis
- Assure that fixed extinguishing systems (i.e. sprinklers) are inspected annually by a person knowledgeable in the design and function of the system to assure that the system is maintained in good operating condition





- **D** Review emergency action plan/procedures at least annually
- **D** Review and practice evacuation routes and procedures at least annually
- □ Provide fire-safety equipment usage education upon initial employment and at least annually thereafter (OSHA 29 CRF 1910.157(g) 157(g)(2))
- □ Train on how to shut off gas and electrical power in case of emergency
- Ensure that flammable liquids are properly stored in original container with legible/ easy to identify labels
- Ensure that flammable liquids with certain flashpoints are stored in proper storage containers when not in use
- □ Prohibit smoking in or near storage areas
- Prohibit smoking inside, near working stations or in company-owned vehicles
- □ Review hazard communication program
- □ Ensure easy access to updated Safety Data Sheets (SDS)
- □ Avoid poorly ventilated areas where a chemical is being used
- Properly clean chemical spills
- □ Ensure the use of personal protective equipment (PPE)

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
